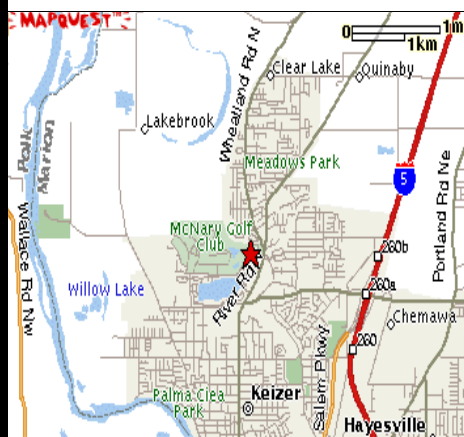
Directions to Luncheon Meeting Location:
