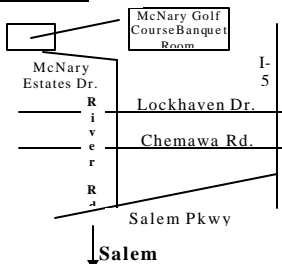

We hope to announce the slate of nominees in the near future. The actual elections will be held in conjunction with our annual business meeting in December



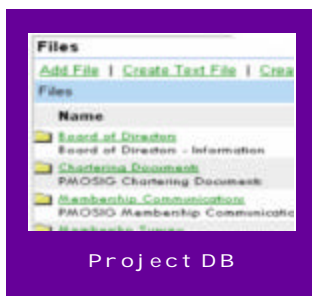
Teams Collaborate Online

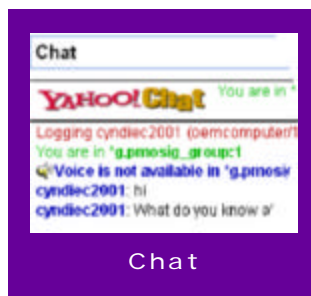


For project managers that live in the trenches of managing projects, they require answers in real-time to address the day-to-day job challenges. That's why project managers are setting up interactive websites for their teams. Sites such as these provide the mechanism for project managers to connect with team members (and visa versa) to do actual project work. Since the tool is accessible via the Internet, it crosses firewalls, locations and other barriers, thus taps the entire team into a common source. Once provided access, members can view project documentation, they can update or post to project deliverables, team tasks, and schedules. Some tools have active polling that let members vote on proposed resolutions, ideas, etc. offline from physical meetings. You see, the project site is the central meeting place - the water cooler - where members can go to research, get the latest, report in, collaborate, chat, work on and post tasks, or just to impart their nuggets of wisdom.

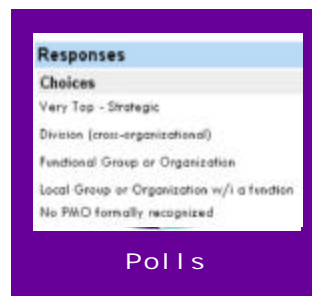
